Rita Couzins - the lady who works tirelessly, putting in funding bids, has many sleepless nights making sure all the finances are in order. She gives a summary of some of the money and events which raised funds in 2016.

**JAN -** We started the year with 144 referrals. The Wire Belt Company at Sittingbourne raised a magnificent £647, The Dover Athletic Football Supporters Club £1011.

**FEB -** Pamper & Purchase night organised by Lyn Baseley at Oasis Isle of Sheppey Academy - which raised £459.

**MARCH** - The Wire Belt Company to continue to support us, Our lovely Volunteer, Maggie Keen's Fitbit, KCC Cllr Andrew Bowles £1500.

APRIL - Easter Egg Hampers £700, Jeff's Bike Ride, Guitar & Violin, with lessons.

MAY - Sport Relief £1000, Jeff's Gravesend Dart's Match.

JUNE - Gillian's Birthday Party £1000+, Sport's Relief £1000, Latino Night.

JULY - Pink Ribbon £5000 for breast cancer referrals.

AUG - Swale Councillors £2000.

**SEPT -** Wire Belt Company £1322 which arrived the day we received ten referrals.

**OCT -** We held a "Soul Midwives" - TLC Workshop with 26 therapists attending. Memory Lane Concert and Helen & Tim's Curry Night. We received 60 referrals for the month, the highest monthly number so far.

**NOV -** Launch of the THTT Calendar. Golding Homes have again supported us with another £1000. Our lovely nurses from the Charles Dickens Ward, at Maidstone held a quiz night at Allington, and with match funding by Apple it took the figure raised to £1090.

**DEC -** Pink & Green Ball at Dover, final figures still awaited, but a very successful event with a bonus of £1000 from Barclays Bank as match funding. Our wonderful Trustee Therapist, Gillian drove this event to being the success it was. Another of our amazing therapists, Shelley Cogger-Ellingworth, from Gillingham, held an event for us recently - I will post details of the amount raised in our next newsletter.

We have had wonderful support from Asda & Waitrose branches across the County.

A special mention to Jo Taylor, our lovely therapist from Gillingham, who lost her mum to cancer, and Gillian's Dad who sadly passed away, they both asked for donations to The Trust.

Finally, we are currently treating 286 people from right across the County, and almost double that at the beginning of the year. We have received our 1,000 referral since the Trust began in 2010 - One thousand people who have benefitted from "Harmony's Hands", We have nearly doubled last year's figures - so if it carries on at the same rate as previous years, doubling each year, next year we would be looking at 1,000 referrals!. We receive many referrals from Hospices, for the people at End of Life, who want to stay in their own homes. This is why the "Soul Midwives" TLC workshop was so beneficial to our therapists. We must increase our income to support these requests from the hospice social workers and nurses. We are currently treating 75 Hospice referrals.
